Party Politics or Puppetry

Party politics puts power into the hands of puppets - puppets controlled by globalists with anticonstitutional interests – and explicit eugenic interests.

The globalists will not deal directly with the public – they need these intermediaries who are chosen to put on a "friendly face" - and take a fall if a strategy back-fires.

Voting for a party is our established habit. And people will continue to do so. But in parallel to this we must start developing a grass-roots movement that is able to coordinate resistance to unethical top-down mandates.

Over the last 2 years we have witnessed how parliaments, governments, governors and councils are able to act with TOTAL disregard to the safety, prosperity and welfare of the populations they were entrusted with.

As new elections approach, individual party leaders are once again hyped as the solution to our problems. But the very problem IS pinning our hopes on a single party!

Growing a Solution

What is needed is not the focusing of our hopes and welfare upon a single party but rather a devolution of power to the people.

We can use the current interlude to consolidate the union of people, not under an official party, but under an unofficial party banner, to create a sense of unity and coordinated resistance to any future totalitarian illegal policy.

In each town, chapters can be formed under the banner of a party name and go door to door canvassing, like politicians do, to build up a significant membership base. Gathering the contact details of members and having a strong presence in every town would give these chapters the ability to coordinate noncompliance and mutual aid in the event of further tyranny.

The result would be a "coordinated public". The power resides in the public, and the creation of local autonomous but linked chapters under the banner of a party name would devolve power from single remote personalities to thousands of networked local groups.

These local groups could coordinate resources, mutual aid and non-compliance within their local areas, and they could network with one another whilst remaining autonomous. Regular canvassing and strategy meetings would be beneficial.

Summary

In summary, the simple solution is "a coordinated public". That's all it takes. And this is best achieved at a local level. Thousands of autonomous chapters, operating under a common banner, networked with other chapters, but not under their control. Each chapter seeking to alert, protect and inform, with a purpose to facilitate mutual aid and non-compliance in the event of any top-down directive that is harmful to the public.
